FOSTERING OUR MISSION OF PROMOTING UNDERSTANDING

It has always been the mission of the Better Hong Kong Foundation ("Foundation") to encourage ideas exchange and to promote understanding and collaboration between Hong Kong, Mainland China and counterparts around the world. In June, the Foundation sent again its annual delegation to the U.S. which was co-led by Executive

Committee Chairman Mr. Ronnie Chan and Council Member Dr. Roy Chung.

The delegation exchanged views with interlocutors in the U.S. on the latest developments in Hong Kong and Mainland China, as well as the most recent updaters concerning the Sino-U.S. relationship following the first visit of the new Chinese President Xi Jingping to the U.S. In addition,

the Foundation organized its first delegation to Taiwan in April updating each other about the latest economic and cultural developments and to explore collaborations. Meetings with the mayors of Taipei and Taichung were enlightening in particular due to their success in cultivating local culture.

Throughout the year, the Foundation's representatives met with thought leaders who visited Hong Kong, to enhance understanding of the latest developments of each other's city and country. They included French Minister of Economy and Finance, Mr. Pierre Moscovici: French Minister of Foreign Affairs, Mr. Laurent Fabius; President of the George Washington University, Dr. Steven Knapp; Director of the Economics Department of Israel's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Mr. Asher Yarden; CEO of German Asia-Pacific Business Association, Mr. Timo Prekop; and Senior Fellow of the Fraser Institute, Dr. Mark Milke. In May, the Foundation hosted a discussion luncheon for a U.S. congressional staffer delegation.

In October, under the 4th China-U.S. Journalists Exchange program, the Foundation hosted seven U.S. journalists visiting Beijing, Nanchang and Hong Kong. The trip allowed them to experience developments in Hong Kong and in Mainland China. By visiting places and interacting with people, we hope that the journalists were able to explore Hong Kong and Mainland China with different perspectives.

PREPARING FOR TREMENDOUS OPPORTUNITIES IN CHINA

China demonstrated its determination in furthering reforms at the Third Plenary Session of 18th Communist Party of China (CPC) Central Committee. One recent reform includes the newly established Pilot Free Trade Zone in Shanghai which was one of the focuses of this year's annual October conference in Shanghai. The conference was jointly organized by the Foundation with Shanghai Chinese People Political Consultative Conference and the Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences. Henggin is another area recently approved by the State Council to explore the new mode of cooperation between Guangdong, Hong Kong and Macao under the policy of "One Country, Two

Systems". In September, the Foundation invited the Director of Administrative Committee of Hengqin New Area, Mr. Niu Jing, to share with our members and guests on its development plan.

Internationally, China continues to play a more important role on the world stage. The Foundation hosted a number of luncheons and meetings with leaders from China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, including Mr. Song Zhe, the Commissioner in Hong Kong; Mr. Qin Gang, Director-General of Information Department; Mr. Chen Xiaodong, Director-General of Department of Asian & North African Affairs; Mr. Chen Yuming, Ambassador to Australia; Mr. Li Jinzhang, Ambassador to Brazil and Ms. Yang Xiuping, Ambassador

to ASEAN; to learn more about China's foreign policy and the opportunities and challenges ahead.

This year, Hong Kong has been consecutively ranked as the most competitive city in the China Urban Competitiveness Report by the Chinese Academy of Social Science since 2007. Hong Kong has its unique competitive advantages, especially in playing the role of the "super connector" providing the necessary funding, talent and internationally recognized business system for the world and China. In May, the Secretary for Justice, Mr. Rimsky Yuen, spoke at the Foundation's luncheon. He shared his thought on the great potential of Hong Kong as a regional arbitration

The Foundation continues its efforts in nurturing the young, an invaluable asset for society. The 7th Hong Kong Cup Diplomatic Knowledge Contest, jointly organized by the Foundation, the Office

of the Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the HKSAR and the Hong Kong Education Bureau, is a contest to broaden students' knowledge in international affairs. Nearly 4,000 students from primary and secondary schools participated in the contest. The Foundation also supported events encouraging our younger generation to deliberate and pursue their goals through events such as the Youth Housing Forum, Change Maker Forum and InnoBrand2013. Likewise, the Foundation recognizes companies adopting various measures

in achieving sustainable development including building a green environment and enhancing social responsibility. In this regard, the Foundation gave its continued support to the CAPITAL Entrepreneur Green Enterprise Awards & Outstanding Green Awards and the Prime Awards for Corporate Social Responsibility.

ANNUAL DELEGATION TO THE UNITED STATES

Each year, the Foundation organizes an annual delegation to the United States. The goal is to provide an annual update about Hong Kong's present situation, share our perspectives on developments in China, exchange views with interlocutors in the U.S. and gauge the temperature in the Beltway, as well as better understand their views on developments in Hong Kong, China, the U.S. and the China-U.S. relationship. This year, the delegation visited New York and Washington D.C. from 10 - 13 June 2013.



2013 CHINA-U.S. JOURNALIST EXCHANGE

In an effort to enhance the understanding of China and Hong Kong by the American media, since 1996 the Foundation has invited six to eight American journalists each year to visit China and Hong Kong. The Foundation sponsored and organized their trip. With the support of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the PRC, the program enables the journalists to meet with senior central government officials in Beijing and local municipal officials in one of the second or third tier cities in China. The Foundation also organizes meetings with key industry and business players, academic and research institutions and media figures to broaden the participants' network other than providing them an overview of the cities they have visited. This year, the Foundation, in association with the All-China Journalists Association (ACJA) and the East-West Center, organized the Fourth China-U.S. Journalists Exchange program, as an expansion of the original Hong Kong Journalism Fellows program by adding the visit of the Chinese journalists to the U.S. The theme of this year's program is "New U.S.-China Relationship".

A delegation of six senior U.S. journalists visited Beijing, Nanchang and Hong Kong from 26 October - 6 November 2013 while seven Chinese journalists visited Washington D.C., New York and Seattle during the same period. After their respective study tours, all Chinese and American journalists met in Honolulu to report on their experiences and to exchange opinions on how media

coverage of each country can be improved. Through direct dialogue with local authorities and communities in different areas and seeing the developments for themselves, the U.S. journalists gain a better understanding of the current situation and future development of Hong Kong and Mainland China.

CONFERENCES & FORUMS

To foster discussion and exchange of views, the Foundation joins hands with prominent institutions to organize various conferences and forums where experts from Hong Kong, Mainland China and overseas can be engaged through direct communication and deliberation.

ANNUAL FORUM IN SHANGHAI - "ECONOMIC TRANSFORMATION AND COLLABORATION BETWEEN SHANGHAI AND HONG KONG"

The Foundation, together with the Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences (SASS) and Shanghai Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CCPC), organized the forum on "Economic Transformation and Collaboration between Shanghai and Hong Kong" on 11 October 2013 aimed at further promoting collaboration between Hong Kong and Shanghai. It was the eighth annual forum that was jointly organized by the three organizations. This year's forum was supported by the Hong Kong and Macao Affairs Office of the Shanghai Municipal People's Government, the Shanghai International Economic Exchange Foundation and the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office in Shanghai. More than 200 experts, scholars, government officials and entrepreneurs from Hong Kong and the Mainland attended the forum. The Chairman of the Shanghai CCPC Mr. Wu Zhiming, the President of SASS Prof. Wang Zhan together with the Council Member of the Foundation Mr. Matthew Lam officiated at the opening ceremony of the forum.

FORUM ON FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF HENGQIN, ZHUHAI

Hengqin New Area is located on Hengqin Island in the south of Zhuhai city, Guangdong Province, connected to Macao by a bridge. In August 2009, the State Council approved the Overall Development Plan of Hengqin, which clarifies the development positioning of Hengqin, i.e. a demonstration area exploring the new mode of cooperation between

Guangdong, Hong Kong and Macao under the policy of "One Country, Two Systems". On 17 September 2013, the Foundation invited Mr. Niu Jing, Director of the Administrative Committee of Hengqin New Area to share with the Foundation's members and guests the development plan and prospects of Hengqin at the Foundation's seminar where Mr. Liu Jiangcheng, Deputy Director of the Hong Kong and Macao Affairs Bureau of Zhuhai also attended.



SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT OF HONG KONG

With globalization, rapid change and worldwide competition, we cannot be complacent regarding the current state of affairs. The Foundation, in collaboration with renowned research institutes, conducts studies on the competitiveness of urban cities in China as well as benchmarking world cities in the pursuit of excellence. We also recognize the importance of Hong Kong's youth development and the cultivation of a green environment and corporate social responsibility for the betterment and sustainable development of Hong Kong.

2013 CHINA URBAN COMPETITIVENESS REPORT

The press conference of the 2013 China Urban Competitiveness Report (Hong Kong) was held in Hong Kong on 20 May 2013. It was organized by the Better Hong Kong Foundation and co-organized by the Center for City and Competitiveness of the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (CASS) and the Hong Kong Institute of Asia-Pacific Studies of the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Led by Prof. Ni Pengfei of the CASS, the theme of this year's report was "New Standards: Ideal City of Sustainable Competitiveness". Before the press conference, the Foundation invited a group of experts from the academic and business sectors to participate in the luncheon discussion session. At the press conference chaired by the Foundation's Executive Director Ms. Karen Tang, Prof. Ni gave a presentation on the report and further explained the overall competitiveness of Hong Kong.

Hong Kong retains its leading position in comprehensive economic competitiveness but the speed of growth is slowing down. Hong Kong also leads in sustainable competitiveness but weak in the sub-index of knowledge-based Hong Kong is a developed the overall performance in various areas is satisfactory. However, the financial crisis is still protectionism is

deepening, and the world economy is facing a downturn while international trade protectionism is increasing. Nevertheless, the Asia-Pacific region maintains a relatively rapid rate of growth and China becomes the driving force for development. Urbanization in Mainland China is fast and, with improvements. THE 7TH HONG KONG CUP DIPLOMATIC KNOWLEDGE CONTEST

In collaboration with the Office of the Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the PRC in the HKSAR and the Education Bureau of the HKSAR Government, the Foundation jointly organized the 7th Hong Kong Cup Diplomatic Knowledge Contest aimed at raising students' interest in international affairs and knowledge of the nation's foreign policy.

Since the launch of the contest in 2007, more than 200,000 students from primary and secondary schools have participated in the contest. This year, we have received

enrollments from more than 100 school teams and over 4,000 students. Two competitions on T-Shirt and Desktop Icon designs were organized alongside the main contest to encourage more participation from students.

On 6 July 2013, six shortlisted teams competed for the championship of this year's contest in the Final. Their knowledge of foreign diplomatic affairs of the PRC, Hong Kong-related foreign affairs, national and international affairs, international relationships and diplomatic etiquette, was challenged at the contest. After the fierce

competition, the championship went to the Sing Yin Secondary School which also won the contest last year.

On 9 – 16 August 2013, a study tour to Beijing and Harbin was organized for the winning teams. Through the contest, we hope that young people and the general public in Hong Kong will become more interested in learning about the development of China in the context of world diplomacy.
