MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

The year, 2016, has been full of changes and surprises, and causes uncertainty in 2017. While some black swans have taken off, it seems some are still in the pipeline. Internationally, we have seen the changing of guards and it is continuing. New leaders are assuming the driver's seats. Inevitably, we are cautious of the risk of populism and protectionism. However, I have the hope that most leaders will have the wisdom, courage and vision to strike a balance between the short term interest of their nationals and a long-term policy for sustainable development for the majority.

The "new normal" for China, with a growth of GDP at the rate of around 6.5%, is now mostly regarded by people as a reasonable and sustainable figure of growth. The launch of China's grand plan of "One Belt One Road" ("OBOR") is also perceived by many as an opportunity for new growth, development and collaboration for the countries along and around the area. The objective is to create win-win scenarios for all parties. Hong Kong, as an international

financial center and an open and free economy, is eager to participate and will definitely benefit and contribute to this. We need the concerted effort of different parties to crystalize the plan and to tap into this golden opportunity.

2017 is the 20th anniversary of Hong Kong returning to the motherland. Under the Basic Law of the HKSAR, Hong Kong has been enjoying the advantages of "One Country, Two Systems". We are determined to exercise the high degree of autonomy while upholding the principle of one country. We are proud and lucky to

have the best of different sides: rule of law, free flow of capital, talent and information, and the huge opportunity and support of the whole of Mainland China. Subsequent to the launch of Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect in 2014, the Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect was launched in 2016. This would certainly further strengthen Hong Kong's role as a "superconnector" between the Mainland China and the globe.

With the light speed deployment of technology and social media, things are changing fast, so are public sentiments. The perceived impact of globalization, the good side and the bad side, is incredibly more obvious and views are diverse and polarized. We need leaders from all sides to work together and to engage the community to cope with the changes. And we need a community willing to be engaged and be patient. Let us join hands to listen to each other, take responsibility and be rational, so as to lead the world in the right direction and we look forward to an even better Hong Kong.

Cultivate Communications and Foster Understanding and Collaboration

Communications is important to build understanding among different groups of people, which could help foster collaborations. It is especially important for the two great powers in the world, China and the U.S., to engage in dialogue and to collaborate. Hong Kong is functional in facilitating the exchanges. The Better Hong Kong Foundation ("the Foundation") has been organizing delegations to the U.S. every year. In June, the Foundation's Executive Committee Chairman Mr. Ronnie Chan and myself led a group of eight Council Members on a visit to Washington D.C. and New York where views on issues related to Hong Kong, Mainland China and the U.S. were shared. In September, the Foundation jointly organized the 7th China-U.S. Journalists Exchange Program with the All-China Journalists Association and the East-West Centre. We brought six senior U.S. journalists to Beijing, Zhengzhou and Hong Kong. They appreciated the opportunity to visit places and meet with officials and people from different organizations and professions, and regarded these personal experiences amazing and valuable. It is equally rewarding for them to exchange with the group of five Chinese journalists in Washington D.C, who visited the U.S. under the same program. We hope that these exchanges could bring about further exchanges and views sharing among them and beyond.

The Foundation was honored to host luncheons and meetings for a number of prominent officials from the Mainland Authority, for us to understand better the nation's policies on various aspects including its foreign policies as well as its reform and development plan. Guests included the Ambassador to the Netherlands Mr. Chen Xu, the Ambassador to Poland Mr. Xu Jian, the Ambassador to Mexico Mr. Qiu Xiaoqi, the Ambassador to Thailand Mr. Ning Fukui and the Ambassador to Mauritius Mr. Li Li; Director-General of Information Department Mr. Lu Kang and Director-General of Department of Treaty and Law of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Mr. Xu Hong; Deputy Director of the Research Office of the State Council Mr. Han Wanxiu; and Deputy Director of the Western Development of the National Development and Reform Commission Mr. Zhai Dongsheng.

As Asia's world city, Hong Kong is a great place for global thought leaders to meet. The Foundation had the opportunity to host some of them, including delegations of congressmen from the European Union (EU), the United Kingdom and New Zealand as well as congressional staffers from the U.S.; chairmen of chambers of commerce from Israel, Malaysia and Switzerland; innovation and technology experts from EU and Korea; a university dean from the U.S.; and a research center director from

Switzerland. These meetings are truly fruitful since the leaders are thoughtful and inspirational and the network established are valuable.

Hong Kong affairs are always at the heart of the Foundation. This year, we have invited Mr. Tung Chee-hwa, Vice Chairman of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference and first Chief Executive of the HKSAR; Prof. K C Chan, Secretary Financial Services & the Treasury; Mr. Lau Kong-wah, Secretary for Home Affairs; and Prof. Ba Shusong, Chief China Economist of the Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Ltd to share with us their insights on economic, political and social developments in Hong Kong. Particularly, we were deeply honored to have invited the Chief Executive Mr. Leung Chun-ying to deliberate his vision on Hong Kong at our annual spring luncheon for consuls general and chairmen of international chambers of commerce in Hong Kong in February.

Nurture the Youth and Facilitate Their Growth

Young people are the key driving force of our society. We are eager to facilitate them to develop their talent and to provide any necessary guidance. Aiming to broaden primary and secondary students' knowledge in international affairs and foreign policies of our country, the Foundation together with the Office of Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the HKSAR and the Hong Kong Education Bureau have been organizing the Hong Kong Cup Diplomatic Knowledge Contest for ten consecutive years. Nearly 190,000 students have participated in the contest since its launch in 2007. In May, we also joined hands with the Junior Chamber International Hong Kong to coorganize the first Hong Kong Partnership Summit which engaged our young people to discuss the current and future challenges of Hong Kong.

We also need to explore new opportunities for the sustainable growth of our society. In November, the Foundation together with the Shanghai Academy of Social Science and Shanghai CPPCC organized the annual Shanghai conference. Its purpose was to facilitate an in-depth discussion on how the two cities could leverage the advantages of each to maximize business potential, especially on the financial front, under the "One Belt, One Road" plan. Innovation and technology is another area which young people could develop and pursue excellence. Therefore, the Foundation supported the APAC Innovation Summit 2016 and Smart City Campaign organized by the Hong Kong Science and Technology Parks Corporation. We also supported various awards to recognize and showcase various business sectors for their achievements in corporate social responsibility and outstanding professionalism.

2016 China-U.S. Journalist Exchange

In an effort to enhance the understanding of China and Hong Kong by the American media, since 1996 the Foundation has invited six to eight American journalists each year to visit China and Hong Kong. The Foundation sponsored and organized their trip. With the support of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the PRC, the program enables the journalists to meet with senior central government officials in Beijing and local municipal officials in one of the second or third tier cities in China. The Foundation also organizes meetings with key industry and business players, academic and research institutions and media figures to broaden the participants' network other than providing them an overview of the cities they have visited. This year, the Foundation, in association with the All-China Journalists Association (ACJA) and the East-West Center, organized the Sixth China-U.S. Journalists Exchange program, as an expansion of the original Hong Kong Journalism Fellows program by adding the visit of the Chinese journalists to the U.S. The theme of this year's program is "Bridging the Gaps in Understanding between China and the United States".

A delegation of six senior U.S. journalists visited Beijing, Zhengzhou and Hong Kong from 17 - 28 September 2016 while five Chinese journalists visited Houston, Texas and Washington D.C. in the U.S. during the same period. After their respective study tours, all Chinese and American journalists met in Washington D.C. to report on their experiences and to exchange opinions on how media coverage of each country can

be improved. Through direct dialogue with local authorities and communities in different areas and seeing the developments for themselves, the U.S. journalists gained better understanding of the current situation and future development of Hong Kong and Mainland China.





SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT OF HONG KONG

With globalization, rapid change and worldwide competition, we cannot be complacent regarding the current state of affairs. The Foundation, in collaboration with renowned research institutes, conducts studies on the competitiveness of urban cities in China as well as bench marking world cities in the pursuit of excellence. We also recognize the importance of Hong Kong's youth development and the cultivation of a green environment and corporate social responsibility for the betterment and sustainable development of Hong Kong.

The 10th Hong Kong Cup Diplomatic Knowledge Contest

Since 2007. the Foundation jointly organized the Hong Kong Cup Diplomatic Knowledge Contest with the Office of the Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the PRC in the HKSAR (Commissioner's Office) and the Education Bureau of the HKSAR Government. The contest aimed to raise students' interest in international affairs and knowledge of the nation's foreign policy and this year marked its 10th anniversary. The theme of this year's contest was "Great Power Diplomacy: Change and Continuity".

Over 5,700 students participated in this year's contest. After first-round
